Welcome to Nursing 1900! The First Day of Class: Tuesday 03/03/2020.

Clinical assignments are as follows for all Sections.

Students in Section **01** are to meet their clinical instructor in the main lobby at Maimonides Medical Center Hospital at 8:00am, Wednesday, 03/04/2020. Students in Section **02** are to meet their clinical instructor in the main lobby of Coney Island Hospital at 8:00 am on Wednesday, 03/04/2020. Students in Section **03** are to meet their instructor in the main lobby at Coney Island Hospital at 8:00 am on Monday, 03/09/20. Students on Section **04** should meet their instructor in the main lobby of Maimonides Hospital at 8am on Monday, 03/09/20. Students in Section **05** will have their first clinical day on Monday, 03/09/2020, and are to meet their clinical instructor in the main lobby of Brookdale Hospital at 8am. Students in Section **06** should meet their instructor in the main lobby of Maimonides Medical Center at 4:00 **pm** on Monday, 03/09/20. All students except those at Maimonides are required to purchase navy blue scrubs for their clinical rotation. **All students** need to have a white lab coat. Please bring your scrubs and lab coat with you on the first day of clinical. Do not wear your scrubs while in transit to your clinical sites. You will change at the site. Students at Maimonides will be given scrubs (not lab coats) on the first day of clinical which you will return on the last clinical day.

All students should report to their respective clinical sites at the assigned times and places in full KCC white uniform with their KCC ID, and proof of their flu shot.

ALL students must have health clearance, verification of influenza vaccination, and a valid CPR certification prior to the start of classes. A copy of verification of influenza vaccination must be brought to the clinical agency on the first clinical day. **Please retain a copy of each of these; some of the clinical agencies require a copy of this documentation for their records.*

*****Please Note: You are no longer required to purchase individual malpractice insurance as CUNY has purchased a policy that covers all nursing students.**

The first day of Lecture for students in Sections 01,02 and 03 is Tuesday, 03/03/2020. The first day of lab and lecture for students in Sections 04, 05 and 06 is Wednesday, 03/04/2020.

All students are required to complete and pass a dosage calculation exam the first week of classes. ALL students must submit health clearance, proof of flu shot, and a valid CPR certification to the Nursing office prior to the start of classes. Please retain a copy of each of these; the clinical agencies require a copy of this documentation for their records. (As noted above, you must bring proof of your flu shot with you to the first clinical). Failure to have health clearance, proof of flu shot, and CPR certification will result in a clinical absence.

During your first week in this MINI, you will rotate through Labor and Delivery. It will be extremely beneficial for you to become familiar with certain aspects of the delivery of care to women and their families when they are in labor, **PRIOR** to attending clinical. Therefore, Chapters 13 and 14, Nursing Care During Labor and Birth and Intrapartum Fetal Surveillance, should be read prior to the first week of classes. Keep in mind and try to respond to the following questions while reading:

- 1) What is involved in a nursing assessment of a woman in labor?
- 2) How is the fetus assessed?
- 3) What is the difference between normal and abnormal labor?
- 4) What is the nurse’s role in supporting and advocating for a woman in labor?
- 5) Identify five nursing interventions to prevent fetal compromise.
