We want to share some updates with you regarding our work within the Division.

DesignWorks User Experience (UX) 2.0: The Division of Workforce Development and Continuing Education was awarded a \$320,000 grant for DesignWorks User Experience (UX) 2.0. Design Works will offer a robust, industry responsive training program, that supports participants with relevant curriculum and career readiness services. This technology career pathways program was developed in response to the NYS Workforce Development Initiative, a part of Governor Cuomo's \$175 million initiative. Participants will develop hands-on skills that prepare them to succeed as junior UX designers, entrepreneurs should they pursue freelance opportunities, and design an e-portfolio upon completion of the training.

Center for Career Development: The Center has worked with faculty and special student populations to host career development workshops on topics including resume writing, career exploration, and professional resources and programming. The team continues to partner with employers to host information and recruitment sessions for students. Sessions have already been held with Dataminr, FDNY and Primark and they plan to host Macmillan Publishing, US Secret Service and Coney Island Workforce 1 in the coming month. Social Work/Mental Health Continuing Education Program: The College was approved by NYSED as a Continuing Education provider for licensed social workers (LMSW & LCSW) and mental health counselors (LMHC). In collaboration with the Mental Health and Human Services Program, our first CE offering titled "Addressing the Need for Awareness and Prevention of Family and Community Violence" was fully enrolled, drawing community, college faculty and staff mental health professionals. The day-long workshop provided 7 CE hours required for SW and MHC licensing as well as resources and skills needed to better support clients and students in domestic violence and abusive situations.
