Center for Career Development & Experiential Learning

Internship Fair, where 126 students could meet with employers to discuss and apply for full and part-time employment and internship opportunities. On October 19th, the Center partnered with the Criminal Justice program to host a Fair. There were 23 employer partners, Kings County District Office, New York Police Department, NYC Sheriff, US Secret Service, and NYC Administration for Children's Services, to name a few, who shared the application and job requirements for students interested in the field. Special thanks to Dr. Vanda Seward and her team from the Behavioral Sciences department for the collaboration.

Another successful Leadership Development Seminar was facilitated in collaboration with the ASAP program. Fifteen (15) students participated in this 2-day event to gain leadership skills that employers are looking for in candidates. Topics included leadership styles, conflict management, active listening, growth mindset, and delegation skills.

Grants and Awards

The division's proposal for Coding for User Experience (UX) through CUNY's Upskilling year-long program was awarded \$99,000. The new course, written by one of our long-time instructors, will be specialized in UX and contain foundational coding elements that designers need to know to be more attractive to employers and successful in the workplace. Students will receive training in Visual Design, Human Centered Design, and enhanced Coding for Designers at no cost, live online via Zoom. Students will receive support with job placement, career advancement, and/or applying to college upon successfully completing the program. For eligibility requirements and how to apply, click here.

Another successful award in the amount of \$900,000 by Equinor/NYC Economic

Development Corporation's Offshore Wind Ecosystem Fund for the CUNY Offshore Wind

Advisory Network (OWAN) - Bridges to Offshore Wind program. The CUNY OWAN is a
consortium of four CUNY colleges: Kingsborough, LaGuardia, College of Staten Island,
and New York City College of Technology. Bridges to Offshore Wind is an interactive
instructional seminar for people interested in learning about the region's offshore wind industry,
highlighting each college's unique training in maritime, electrical, construction and
manufacturing, assembly, and supply chain management.

Program and Partnership Updates

In collaboration with **Jobs For The Future** (JFF), we will provide **Augmented Reality Training for UX Designers**. This hybrid program will be provided at **no cost** to students who completed UX Design training, available to meet weekly at the Central Brooklyn Public Library, and be able to participate in a hackathon. Students who complete the program will take the **Meta AR Certificate Exam** and, upon passing, be connected to Meta career program job board.

The Flex Into UX program concluded this month. After attending 13 UX Design class sessions between June and August, students participated in a Design-A-Thon. This was the culminating event in collaboration with Brooklyn Public Library's Business & Career Center and Kingsborough. The program provided over 90 Brooklyn residents with the opportunity to

explore careers in user experience (UX) design by attending free classes that were held both online and in person.

The new UX Upskilling online program started on October 24, with a cohort of 32 students. The first hour of the session was orientation, where students learned about the college, program instructors, and staff, immediately followed by the first class. The program will end in March 2024. ESL/HSE/SNAP, as a member of the CUNY Consortium, is currently participating in a scheduled audit of its Adult Literacy free ESL grant program. The program provides ESL support and literacy development two evenings per week each semester, from 5:00-10:00 pm.

Students who complete this part-time program, as a follow-up, register for contextualized ESL/Food Handlers, full-time, intensive ESL, CLIP, or the KELI program. The Kingsborough English Language Institute's (KELI) tuition-based program provides all eligible students an opportunity to improve their language skills to prepare for college or employment. However, for those students who apply and are accepted to a CUNY college, the **CUNY Language Immersion Program (CLIP)**, is an ideal option, especially developed for these students. Professional Development/Networking

Becky Fine-Firesheets and Jessica Cinelli presented at the New York Association of Training and Employment Professionals (NYATEP) Annual Conference in Syracuse, NY. Their presentation, In the Weeds: Cannabis Equity & Cannavism, discussed the development of the recently launched From Cannabis to Cuisine training program, including how it was developed, community engagement, biases and fears, student support, and labor market trends. The presentation was well-received by workforce development professionals from across the state, including elected officials, and their message about cannabis equity and creating pathways into the industry. With a midpoint retention rate of 97%, we are quite confident that our first cohort will be a success!
