Grant Proposals

The Division was <u>awarded \$250,000</u> for a new program, Contextualized Industry Training in Healthcare and Construction, as part of the CUNY English Language for Work Initiative. With this funding, we will develop a contextualized job training curriculum in two sectors – Healthcare and Construction – for participants with limited English language proficiency. This new curriculum will follow the I-BEST model in KCC's highly successful Steps to Success and Strides to Continuing Success ESL/Food Handlers Program. Students will receive ESL instruction and industry training, case

management assistance, metrocards, food vouchers, and class supplies. We will serve 75 participants between now and March 2025.

We submitted a \$580,000 proposal to CUNY's Workforce Development Initiative grant program for KCC's Design Path – Careers in UX Design and Artificial Intelligence. This program will build upon our successful UX Design program by developing an AI for UX Designers module. This curriculum will be developed by a longtime UX Design instructor, a member of the division's Tech Advisory Board, and will feature a Hack-athon in partnership with the college's Graphic Design & Illustration program. We will serve 100 students in 4 cohorts over 2 years if awarded.

The Community Farm and Garden (CFG) submitted a proposal to the City Gardens Club of NYC to fund the creation of a new composting system. In 2022, the CFG was awarded a grant by the City Gardens Club to fund the creation of a designated children's space on the farm.

Workforce Trainings

CUNY Fatherhood Academy: Two alumni from cohort 16 received their GED diploma, and one alumnus applied to attend Kingsborough. Five students enrolled in the College and Career Prep cohort. We are currently recruiting for the upcoming GED cohort. The Maternal Health and Doula Training Program started on February 5 with 50 students enrolled, and 20 are from the Community Health or Nursing departments seeking to complement their degree programs. The program is taught by a DONA certified trainer and students will receive their CUNY Certificate of Completion and DONA Birth Doula Certificate of Completion. The course includes 27 hours of Doula training (including Lactation and Childbirth Education) and 21 hours of Maternal Health education. The next training will be conducted in the summer of 2024. ESL/HSE/SNAP Venture & CLIP Program

CUNY Language Immersion Program (CLIP) is a highly successful ESL program that provides non-native speakers of English who have been accepted to a CUNY college an opportunity to improve their English language skills (for up to four semesters) in an intensive, full-time ESL program. Upon completion of CLIP, graduating students transition to college, better prepared to successfully meet the demands of college coursework. The winter 2024 semester concluded in February with over sixty eligible students successfully completing and testing to matriculate into college credit programs.

Free Adult Literacy and Food Handlers certificate training programs are available to non-native speakers who want to improve their English language skills and pursue further study and employment opportunities for the Winter/Spring 2024 semesters. For
