Change in POL 5200: Comparative Government

Department of History, Philosophy, and Political Science is proposing a change course title and course description for POL 5200.

**FROM:** POL 5200 – COMPARATIVE GOVERNMENT (3 crs. 3 hrs.) The major types of political systems in selected foreign countries. Includes study of the role of ideology, economics, elite groups, political institutions, comparison of Western and non-Western systems, with emphasis on Britain, France, Germany, Italy, the Soviet Union and selected African, Asian, and Latin American countries. Flexible Core: World Cultures and Global Issues (Group A)

TO: POL 5200—COMPARATIVE POLITICS (3 crs. 3 hrs.) An introduction the major types of political systems in the world. Uses both qualitative and quantitative analysis to study the role of ideology, economics, elite groups, and political institutions. Covers Western and non-Western systems, with emphasis on Britain, Germany, the U.S., China, Russia, Nigeria, and selected other countries. Flexible Core: World Cultures and Global Issues (Group A)

Rationale for Change: To reflect changes in the field of political science and eliminate anachronistic references, such as to the Soviet Union.
