RE: Inclusion of Notation Under the Degree Requirements for the A.A.S. Nursing

The Department of Nursing is proposing the inclusion of the following notation under the Degree Requirements for the A.A.S. Nursing related to the inclusion of the LPN to RN Bridge Program (LRN) and NUR 1000 (LPN to RN Bridge Course).

Notation:

Students who are accepted into the LPN to RN Bridge Program (LRN) will complete NUR 1000 - LPN to RN Bridge Course their first semester of Clinical. Upon successful completion of NUR 1000, students will be awarded Credit for Prior Learning (CPL) for NUR 1700, NUR 1800, and NUR 2100.

Rationale for Change:

The Nursing Department has created an *LPN to RN Bridge Program (LRN)* to provide a structured opportunity for Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs) to demonstrate proficiency in Medical Surgical Nursing, Pharmacology, and Nutrition Nursing concepts. These areas of proficiency are embedded in NUR 1700, NUR 1800, and NUR 2100. Completion of NUR 1000 with a minimum grade of "C" allows students to receive Credit for Prior Learning (CPL) for NUR 1700, NUR 1800, and NUR 2100, earning them advanced standing within the Nursing program where they can complete the Clinical Components of the Nursing program in three semesters rather than four (see below *Advanced Standing Pathway Course Sequence*). The inclusion of the notation was necessary to reflect this new advanced standing pathway and denote the course's placement within the program.
