The Department of Communications and Performing Arts is proposing a change in Pre-/Corequisites for JRL 3100 – Basic Journalism

Rationale for Change:

We have opted to reevaluate the pre-/co-requisites for our Journalism courses. One such change pertains to the removal of the ENG 1200 pre-/co-requisite from JRL 3100 because students already directly learn journalistic writing nuances along with foundational writing principles, fostering a seamless learning experience. Additionally, removing the pre-/co-requisite facilitates a smoother academic journey for students. Students would be able to delve directly into JRL 3100 without the potential delay or scheduling conflict of first completing ENG 1200. Furthermore, not all students may have had the chance to complete ENG 1200 or an equivalent before entering the Journalism program. By removing this barrier, we are ensuring that all students, regardless of their prior coursework, have an equal opportunity to pursue JRL 3100.
