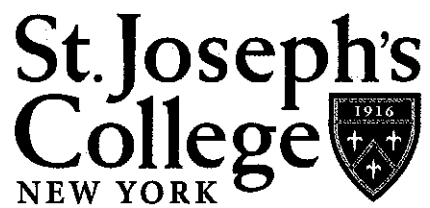

## **Articulation Agreement**

### **St. Joseph's College, NY and Kingsborough Community College**

#### **Education Studies Major**

This document represents a transfer credit articulation agreement between St. Joseph's College, NY, with campuses in Brooklyn and Patchogue, LI, and Kingsborough Community College for students majoring in Education Studies. This will serve as a guiding document for use by students, faculty and administrators of both institutions in clarifying the relationship between the schools and in confirming the way course credits transfer from Kingsborough Community College to St. Joseph's College, NY. The attached Transfer Articulation Course Equivalencies documents are the result of dialogue between the St. Joseph's College, NY and Kingsborough Community College Academic Deans and Department Chairpersons. Each course equivalent has been reviewed by both parties for content and transferability. The agreement may be modified, including adding or deleting course equivalencies, upon agreement of both parties.

Kingsborough Community College A.A. in Education Studies graduates are eligible to receive up to 64 semester hours of transfer credits when transferring to St. Joseph's College, NY. Credit will only be awarded for courses completed with a grade of C- or better. The overall grade point average must meet current St. Joseph's College, NY admissions requirements as stated in the St. Joseph's College, NY Catalogue, as well as program-specific requirements.

The attached articulation agreement serves as a guideline for the maximum number of transfer credits from Kingsborough Community College to St. Joseph's College, NY. Students transferring to St. Joseph's College, NY from Kingsborough Community College with the maximum number of credits will be given the opportunity to complete the requirements for a Bachelor of Arts within four additional semesters of full-time study. St. Joseph's College, NY liberal arts/core requirements, distribution requirements, and course equivalencies for transfer credit purposes are contained within this document.

To complete requirements for the baccalaureate degree, the student is responsible for any core requirements still outstanding; a major of 35-47 credits; any other requirements of the major; and a total of 120-126 credits, of which a minimum of 90 credits must be in the liberal arts for a B.A. degree. Students pursuing the Bachelor of Arts in Child Study must complete at least 32 Child Study credits for students interested in the four-certificate program, and at least 20 Child Study credits for students interested in the two-certificate program, all taken at St. Joseph's College, NY. A description of the Core Requirements, including listings of thematic areas and of integrated learning experiences, is attached. Also attached is an equivalency chart to facilitate analysis of courses of study and of how Kingsborough Community College courses transfer to St. Joseph's College, NY.

Ordinarily, the minimum residency requirement for a St. Joseph's degree is two semesters or 30 credits. Students who transfer to SJC as juniors are usually expected to complete their course and credit requirements at St. Joseph's College, NY.

To better serve the needs of Kingsborough Community College students who are considering a transfer to St. Joseph's College, NY, to facilitate the admissions and transfer process, and to ensure that students are provided with the information they need, it is agreed that

St. Joseph's College, NY will:

- Designate an admissions/academic advisor for KCC students transferring to SJC to assist with the admissions and transfer credit process.
- Conduct an "early-bird" registration program specific to KCC transfer students who complete the admissions process by November 1 for the spring term and April 15 for the fall term.
- Provide monthly on-site admissions and advising sessions on the KCC campus for students interested in transferring to SJC.
- Have faculty continue to work with KCC faculty in reviewing additional courses for transferability
- Designate a financial aid counselor for KCC students transferring to SJC
- Award \$1,000 to KCC Honors Program graduates or to KCC graduates who are members of Phi Theta Kappa. (Confirmation of Phi Theta Kappa membership is required.) A student may receive only one of these two awards, but the award may be added to any other SJC scholarship awarded to the student.

Kingsborough Community College will:

- Publicize this agreement to students, faculty and professional staff in campus publications.
- Have transfer advisors well versed about this agreement to inform interested students about this opportunity.
- Provide a list of and contact information for graduating students to St. Joseph's College, NY upon request.
- Organize an SJC Day on the KCC campus for students to meet with SJC advisors.
- Ensure that SJC brochures, applications and other printed materials are distributed to the Counseling Centers and the academic departments at KCC.
- Advertise any special programs, events or visits that SJC is offering on the KCC campuses.

This agreement will remain in force until either party wishes to terminate.

***Admissions Requirements to Senior College Program***

Graduates must have completed an A.S. degree. Pursuant to University policy, students who have earned a City University Associate in Science (A.S.) degree will be deemed to have automatically fulfilled the lower division liberal arts and science distribution requirements for a baccalaureate degree. Students may be asked to take additional courses which are required by the major department.

For admission to the Child Study Program at St. Joseph's College, NY, graduates must have achieved a minimum overall GPA of 2.8, with a minimum grade of C in Education courses.

**Monitoring, Evaluation and Modification of this Agreement**


This agreement will be monitored by tracking students as they progress through the sequence of upper division courses upon transfer. Academic performance and persistence towards the baccalaureate degree will be evaluated by the Office of the Provost at Kingsborough Community College and the Office of the Dean of the Child Study Program at St. Joseph's College, NY in close consultation with the faculty of the A.S. in Education Studies and the faculty of the B.A. in Child Study. This agreement can be modified with the mutual approval of the two institutions.


**Dissemination of this Agreement**




